- Students are selected for the Scholars programme based on their KS2 data and their performance across maths, English, science, geography, history and modern foreign languages at Sale High School

- Highly developed personal organisation and independent learning skills combined with the self-discipline to utilise them consistently

- Students are expected to take up a significant number of the opportunities offered including those that take place - or require assignments to be completed - outside the timetabled hours of the school day








#### ACADEMIC COMPETITIONS

Scholars will enter a number of internal and external academic competitions. These are promoted to broaden and extend learning and to build students' confidence in presenting their ideas and arguments. Through competitions, students take ownership of their learning, expect excellence of themselves and aim for success in a competitive format. Over the course of their time in the Sale Scholars programme students might be involved in delivering speeches, essay writing, poetry and formal presentations. Older students will be encouraged and supported to engage with national academic competitions across academic subjects and topics. The expectation is that these experiences will be enjoyable and rewarding while also developing self-confidence and skills that will be a great asset to students as they seek to achieve aspirational goals.

#### CAREERS ADVICE AND GUIDANCE

Sale Scholars receive careers advice and guidance that is tailored to their academic performance. In Year 9 this will include guidance with regard to the choice of GCSE courses. In Year 10 a priority will be securing dynamic work experience placements. In Year 11 the focus is heavily on ensuring that students are fully prepared for their exams and looking ahead at future career pathways.

Students will be equipped to make informed choices with regard to particular careers such as financial industries, business management, engineering and medicine. There will be a strong emphasis on higher education with Russell Group universities and Oxbridge being of particular interest.



## ENRICHMENT VISITS

Sale Scholars will be exposed to a range of experiences that will stretch and inspire them. Students will be expected to respond to enrichment visits through workshops, discussion, written work or presentations. Events are chosen with a focus academic learning, higher education, careers and the love of learning.
