Yasal Emanduwa: 2nd February 2007-27th July 2021.

We were devastated over the summer to hear of the tragic passing of our Year 9 student Yasal. Yasal was cruelly taken from his family after suffering an intracranial bleed. His funeral took place on 12th August and many of our community attended. We were so proud of his friends who spoke and took part in the service, including friends from his football team Sporting Sale and many of our Year 9 students and families. Sporting Sale have also held a memorial game, wearing Yasal's number 17 on their shirts in tribute. Please see photo below.

COVID 19

I wrote home earlier to remind parents that students no longer have to isolate if they are a close contact as they are under 18 years and 6 months old. This is really good news as so many children had to be sent home from school to isolate previously. If your child is identified as a contact- either through school, home or outside home it is recommended that they get a PCR test as soon as possible and take care to reduce the spread risk whilst waiting for the test result. Thank you

Twice Weekly Testing

We will return to twice weekly testing now we are back in school. Tests will be sent home with your child on Monday 13th September. Can you please supervise students taking a test on a Wednesday and a Sunday evening? Please begin this from Wednesday 15th September. We will send a link to a Microsoft form where you will be asked to register your child's test result. If your child has a positive result on the LFT, they will need to isolate and not come to school. It is advisable also to then book a confirmatory PCR test as soon as possible for them and for household contacts. Isolation only has to start for the household contacts if their PCR comes back positive. If you are unsure in anyway at all, just contact us and we will be happy to offer help and advice. Thank you.

Uniform

On the whole, uniform is looking very good on return. There are a few issues to address particularly around false nails, piercings and ties. We have given students a week of 'grace' to address these issues but the expectation is that all students will be in completely correct uniform by Monday 13th. If there are any issues that we can help with, please contact your Head of Year in the first instance. Thanks for your support with this.

Forgotten Items

As part of our ongoing safety measures against Covid the office will not be able to accept 'forgotten items' brought to school during the day.

New Website

You might have noticed that our new website went live today. We are really pleased with it! There are some tweaks to be made and we would love to know what you think and whether you have any suggestions. We will have the photographer in school next Wednesday taking pictures to use on the new website so we will have some updated photos- including our newer students- on it.

Knowledge Organisers

We introduced these last term as part of the support we were providing to students to help 'catch them up' after the schooling missed due to Covid. We have invested heavily in having these printed out in colour; students will be using them in every lesson and will need to bring them with them as part of their equipment every day. If students lose them, a replacement will cost £2. We will be giving parents further information as to how they can use these with their children to support revision and learning.

I will leave it there. We have had a great start back! We are so pleased that our community is beginning to move to a 'more normal' footing. We really hope that this year we can see a return of all the wonderful activities: clubs, trips, visits that we love to offer. I know it will be a brilliant year - fingers crossed for a more normal one!
