# Covid 19

You will have heard on the news last week that Trafford had the highest C19 rates in the country. This was true in the 12-18 age group but also rates were rising in the 30-40s and the over 60s- parents and grandparents. We have seen an increase in rates in school. We will be sending LFT tests home today. Please continue asking your child to test over the holidays and most importantly on the Sunday before returning to school on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> November. We are having a further round of immunisation in school today and thanks to everyone who has given consent. You are also able to book your child in for a jab via your home medical centres if they have not had one at school.

**Face coverings**- Trafford has now stated that all students should wear a face covering when travelling to and from school on public transport and around school. Send your child to school with a face covering please. I want to keep as many students in school with their friends and learning as possible.

# **Bonfire Night November 5th**

Each year as we draw closer to Bonfire night we send a message home to families to share with students re fireworks. Fireworks are banned in school for the simple reason that they are dangerous. Students will face the strongest consequences including the possibility of permanent exclusion if they have them. Please speak to your child about keeping safe and the dangers of fireworks.
