Dear Parents and Carers,



I hope this letter finds you safe and well! As I write, it is the hottest day in the year and our students are wearing a modified 'summer' uniform of no blazer and no tie or PE kit. We will be putting lots of measures in place to make sure students are safe and as comfortable as possible.
