7	1. How can we improve our study skills? In this first SLD session Year 7s are introduced to study and revision skills that will support them throughout their
	studies at Sale High.
	2. What careers might be suited to me? Students are introduced to Xello, an online careers service provided by GMCA which allows them to build and record
	information about their career preferences and experiences
	3. What are my personal qualities? This unit explores the personal qualities employers are looking for. Students will explore what personal qualities they already
	have and what qualities they would need to develop.
	4. Where am I going and how do I get there? In this unit students begin to consider their future education and career pathway and how they can improve their
	future options and life chances.
	5. What does assertiveness mean? Students will explore the importance of assertiveness in their interactions with others and particularly in the workplace, and
	develop strategies for being more assertive.
8	1. Effective Learners - In this topic students explore what it means to be an effective learner and how the qualities of an effective learner can help you in your
	future education and career.
	2. Employment in the future - Students learn about the different types of work that might be available to them in the future, including jobs that might not even
	exist yet
	3. Team working - Students explore and develop their own team working skills and are encouraged to consider the importance of team work in the workplace
	4. Employability Skills - Students will learn about the skills that employers are looking for and how their own skills might make them employable
	5. Equality and discrimination – In this topic students are introduced to equality and discrimination laws, and the rules employees and employers have to work

9	1. Qualifications and Pathways - In this unit students learn about the different education pathways available to them post 16 and beyond, including
	apprenticeships, A Levels, Degrees and other qualifications
	2. Jobs in Manchester - As part of their careers education, students will learn about the current job market in their local area and the skills and qualifications that
	are in high demand among employers.
	3. Gender stereotypes - In this unit students will be encouraged to recognise and challenge gender stereotypes relating to careers, professions and the world of
	work
	4. <u>Aspirations and role models</u> - Students will consider the importance of role models and consider how their own aspirations are influenced by those around
	them
10	5. <u>Rights and responsibilities</u> - Students will begin to engage with their rights and responsibilities as future employees and their relationship with employers
10	 Personal Presentation - Students will explore employer expectations regarding personal presentation and how they can make themselves more employable. Being Employable - Leading on form the previous topic, students will explore in more detail how to make themselves more employable and consider the skills
	and qualities employers are looking for.
	3. Applying for jobs – Students explore the different ways they can find job vacancies, and the variation in application and interview processes
	4. Communication - In this unit students explore the importance of good communication skills, particularly in the workplace, and are given the opportunity to develop their own interpersonal skills
	5. CVs and personal statements - As a vital part of the application process for further education, and as an introduction to CVs and job applications, it is essential
	that students make the most of this opportunity to learn how to write a high quality personal statement.
11	1. Routes to employment - Students learn about the different pathways into employment and are encouraged to think about how they can approach securing
	their own chosen career
	2. Business structure and organisation - Students explore the different types of business structure and organisation that they might encounter during their
	careers, from sole traders to public companies, and consider the various strengths and weaknesses of each business model.
