**Dear Parents and Carers,** 

As we approach Christmas, I hope you are feeling suitably festive. The last few weeks of term have been filled with celebrations, including our Christmas show, Christmas jumper day, Christmas dinner, and the ever-popular Christmas Fair.

Our students have truly embraced the spirit of giving, taking Christmas cheer out into the community. Year 9 leaders supported St Paul's Community Christmas Tree Festival by decorating themed trees for St Paul's Parish Church. Meanwhile, our Year 7 Choir visited local care homes, offering music, conversation, and companionship at what can be a lonely time for some.

It has been a busy and rewarding Autumn Term. Our School Council attended the Trafford Youth Council meeting, contributing to workshops on youth-led strategies for improving the local area. A special mention goes to Mackenzie in Year 10, who represented Trafford with a rousing speech at the Houses of Parliament! We've also been strengthening links with local primary schools, welcoming pupils for taster sessions and sending our students back to their former schools to share experiences and support Year 6 transition.

Sporting achievements have been another highlight. Year 9 Sports Leaders hosted the Indoor Primary Athletics competition, 19 students competed in the Trafford Schools Cross-Country Championships, and 18 of our female athletes are taking part in the Trafford Schools Swimming Championships.

Beyond sport, our extra-curricular offer continues to thrive. Over 40 students attend weekly LAMDA music, dance and drama workshops, and our Japanese Club is bursting with enthusiasm, attracting around 45 members. Students from Years 8, 9, and 10 also showcased their creativity at a young poetry event at Altrincham Grammar School, submitting original work and engaging with peers from across the area.

This term marked an exciting milestone as we officially joined United Learning Trust. This partnership opens up a wealth of support and opportunities for our school. Visitors from the trust have consistently praised the dedication of staff and students and the excellent behaviour across the school. With their backing, we are confident the shool can continue to go from strength to strength.

Finally, our school rebuild programme is gathering pace. We look forward to sharing more details with you soon about this exciting and transformative project.


