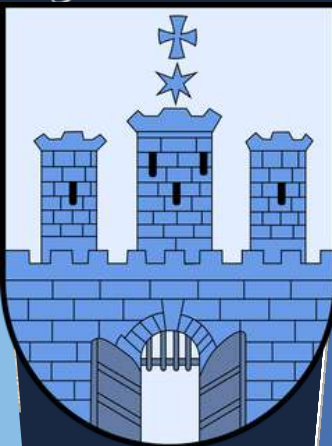

The day finished with a guided walking tour of Oxford, taking in the city's stunning architecture.

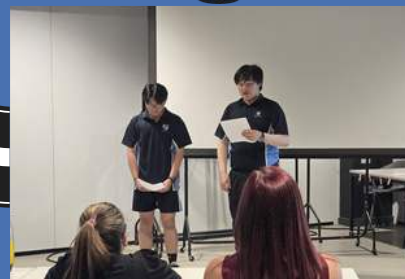
A brilliant opportunity that left our scholars motivated, informed, and excited about their future pathways!

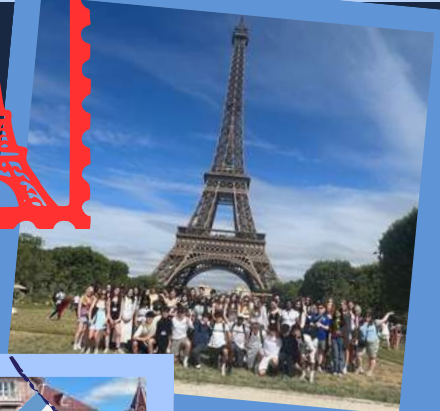

SHS ACHIEVES UNICEF RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOLS SILVER AWARD

We're delighted to announce that Sale High School has been awarded the UNICEF Rights Respecting Schools Award (RRSA) Silver: Rights Aware accreditation. This recognition celebrates the progress we have made in embedding children's rights throughout our school community.

To achieve Silver status, we demonstrated how children's rights are actively promoted through our curriculum, assemblies, form time programme and wider school ethos.

Students learn about the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) through lessons, rights-based assemblies and weekly tutor activities. We have also strengthened student wellbeing through initiatives such as counselling services, ELSA support and our Wellbeing Hub, while encouraging students to take action through charitable, environmental and community projects.

Recent examples include fundraising for marine conservation, donating toys to the Salvation Army, local litter-picking activities and celebrating Cultural Diversity Day.
